COMMUNITY

- Fund and establish Amtrak passenger rail service from Scranton to NY City
- Enhance public transportation serving areas with high density employment opportunities
- Promote expanded region-wide telecommunications/broadband/ 5G network(s)

- Establish Business-Education Career Pathways partnerships for K-12 students
- Fund initiatives designed to attract/maintain professional talent within the regional workforce
- Establish/promote internships and apprenticeships for regional secondary and post-secondary students
- Address the systemic challenges of Childcare in the workforce
- Promote development of regional professional certification and training programs
- Loosen the restrictions on federal and state workforce funds to allow for use tied to local needs/priorities
- Support increased funding of scholarships for PELL eligible students
- Provide early childhood education funding for middle-class families
